GENERAL FINANCIAL AID RESOURCES FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS

Applying for college can feel overwhelming. There are applications to complete, essays to write, and funds to secure. Settling the logistics of financial aid can often be the most stressful part of the application process. Below are some financial aid resources students may wish to consider utilizing as they plan for college.

This guide aims to clarify students' and families' questions about financial aid, connect them to a variety of resources, and alleviate some financial anxiety.

This is a sampling of the opportunities and is not intended to be an exhaustive list.

1. The Basics

Financial aid is offered in different forms. The most common types of financial aid are *scholarships*, *grants*, and *fellowships*. This guide mostly focuses on scholarship opportunities, but it is important to understand the differences between these types of aid.

Scholarships are criteria-based financial aid awards that students are not required to repay. Universities may offer scholarships directly to students, but students should also consider applying for scholarships provided by the government, businesses, and private organizations. Scholarships and *grants* are similar, as grants also do not need to be repaid; however, grants usually include a financial need component, while scholarships may or may not be need-based. If you are looking to finance post-undergraduate educations, you may want to consider applying for a fellowship. *Fellowships* are offered to graduate and professional students who are conducting research; this type of aid offsets the cost of tuition, research, and other general expenses.

2. Online Search Engines

How do students begin their search for these different types of aid? Online search engines are a useful starting point. There are countless free search engines available online, so students may want to establish profiles on multiple websites to capture more opportunities. 3. Federal Grants and Financial Aid

The federal government offers a number of financial aid programs to college students. These programs include *grants* (financial aid that does not need to be repaid), *loans* (borrowed money students must repay with interest), and *work-study opportunities*.

Students interested in receiving federal aid should start by submitting a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Information about the various types of federal financial aid programs, eligibility requirements, and application process is available on the U.S. Department of Education's website: www.studentaid.ed.gov/sa.

4. State Financial Aid

The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA) administers the *State Grant Program* which provides grants to Pennsylvania students to help them afford the costs of attending a college or university of their choice. The amount of funding that students can receive is based upon the student's financial needs and the type of college or university that the student chooses to attend.

PHEAA also administers the *Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program* which provides scholarships to high-achieving students who have completed at least one year of post-secondary education and come from families whose annual total household income does not exceed \$110,000.

5. Work-Study Employment

In addition to the Federal Work-Study Program which students can apply for by submitting a completed FAFSA, Pennsylvania also has its own State Work-Study Program. The program is available to all PA students who meet certain eligibility requirements. 6. College and University On-Campus Resources

College and university offices of financial aid often administer various programs of financial aid funded by the institutions themselves, as well as federal, state, and private sources. Students may find information about available scholarships and other forms of institutional aid by visiting the website of their chosen college or university or by contacting their school's financial aid office directly. Eligibility can be based on a number of factors, including merit, financial need, or intended major.

7. High School Counseling Offices

Students still in high school may also wish to use local resources available to them and reach out to their school counselors or academic advisors, as they often compile and maintain scholarship material. They are likely to have information about which scholarships former graduates have received and may be able to advise current students about how to apply.

8. Employers

Some employers offer scholarships to employees and/or their children or family members. Student job-holders can check with their employer's human resources department to find out more about what may be available. Students may also want to reach out to family members and ask if they know of any scholarship opportunities offered by their places of employment.

9. Religious Institutions

Many religious organizations offer scholarships to their members. Students may wish to check with their place of worship for more information. Even if a local religious institution does not, it may know of other groups that offer scholarships to members of that faith.

10. Companies and Foundations

Many large corporations and foundations offer scholarships to students. Many have broad eligibility requirements, while others are targeted to students interested in particular fields of study. AMS Minority Scholarship: The AMS Minority Scholarships will award funding to minority students who have been traditionally underrepresented in the sciences, especially Hispanic, Native American, and Black/African American students. Funding for the scholarships is provided by donations made by members to the AMS Giving Program. The two-year scholarship is distributed once per year during freshman and sophomore years (second-year funding depends on successful completion of the first academic year). Applicants must be U.S. citizens or hold permanent resident status and must be minority students who will be entering their freshman year of college in the fall.
